Port Sunlight Village was founded by 'Soap King' William Hesketh Lever in 1888. The village was built to house Lever's 'Sunlight Soap' factory workers, but today is home to a fascinating museum, beautiful architecture, a world-class art gallery, stunning parkland and a thriving community. Then travel on to New Brighton.

Voted Britain's Favourite market in 2019 or visit the East Lancs Railway Visit the Flower Show or spend the day in Harrogate

Situated on a private peninsula overlooking stunning coastal scenery, the Italian Riviera meets rural Wales with a riot of colour and architectural styles at Portmeirion Village. The Village is well known as the location for the 1960s cult TV series The Prisoner.

Haworth hosts its annual weekend packed with nostalgia just us as we step back in time to the 1940s

A bustling monthly market in Macclesfield's cobbled Marketplace and streets around 160 + stalls of unique crafts, exceptional food & drink and vintage finds. Then onto Buxton

A city with Roman roots and a Viking past, where ancient walls surround contemporary independent shops and vibrant eateries. York is a fantastic destination for everyone

Scarborough is the original seaside resort; stunning scenery, glorious beaches, loads to see and do – is it any wonder that people have been flocking to Scarborough for nearly 400 years now? You can still immerse yourself in history with Scarborough Castle and the Rotunda Museum of geology or you could venture down to the seafront.

Bakewell may, perhaps, be best known for its famous Bakewell pudding - or should it be tart? Situated in the Derbyshire White Peaks (Peak District National Park) Bakewell offers a charming day out full of rich heritage and tradition. Why not visit one of the many tea rooms or country pubs or perhaps relax down by the River Wye. The true origins of Well Dressing are lost in the mists of time. According to many sources, it developed from a pagan custom of making sacrifice to the gods of wells and springs to ensure a continued supply of fresh water.

Beamish is a world-famous open-air museum, telling the story of life in North East England during the 1820s, 1900s & 1940s. If thats not for you, head into the Metrocentre to shop till you drop!

Thousands of people will flock to Pontefract for a sweet treat at the town's licuorice festival this weekend. The little market town in West Yorkshire is renowned for the Pontefract Cake. Their annual licuorice festival is believed to be the only event in the world that celebrates the plant and it's products.

Barmouth's location on the west coast of North Wales and lying between a mountain range and the sea on the mouth of the river Mawddach is arguably one of the most beautiful locations in Wales.

Five Star Scottish Visitor Attraction, Shopping home of Anvil weddings since 1754. Then board the coach and head off to Dumfries a market town and former royal burgh within the Dumfries and Galloway council area of Scotland.

Visit the Monkey Forest where you can walk where over 140 monkeys live, see them being fed and enjoy a stroll through their enviroment before heading in to Trentham Village to enjoy the shopping and gardens.

Frodsham is a small town that combines the best of both worlds as it is full of village charm; For such a small place, Frodsham has a range of things for its visitors and residents to enjoy including a wander around unique local retailers and historic market. Then after 2 hours we head off to New Brighton.

More than 100 differently designed scarecrows adorn the village and its gardens, hide in corners and appear on rooftops. Then onto Skipton.

From the minute you cross one of the bridges you'll see stunning landscapes, unspoilt coastlines and picturesque towns and villages that are just waiting to be explored.
